

Ping Pong Table Sizes

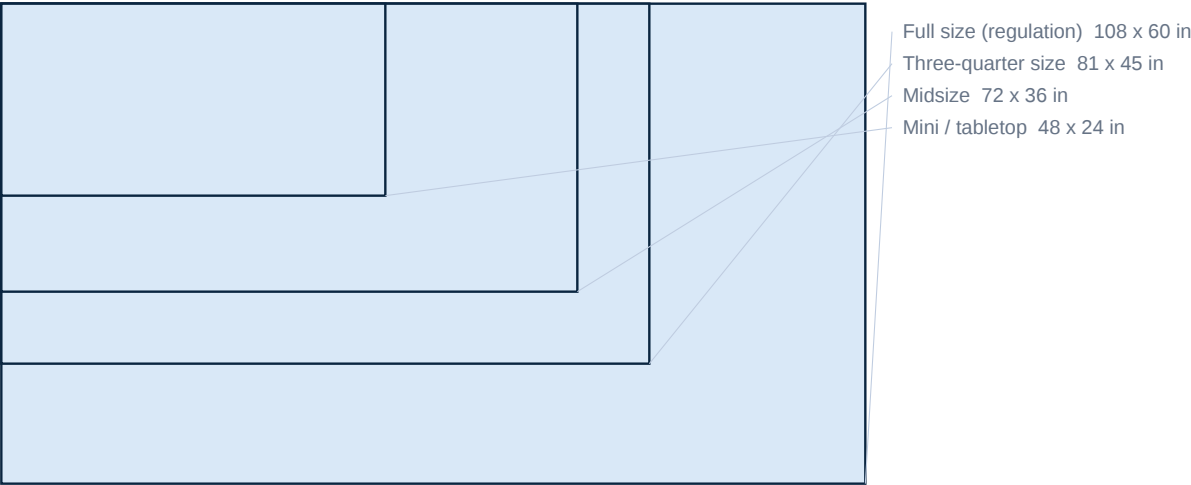
Full, three-quarter, midsize and mini -- and the room each needs

Table	Top	Minimum room	Comfortable room
Full size (regulation) ITTF 9 x 5 ft; every tournament and club table	108 x 60 in (9 x 5 ft)	19 ft x 11 ft	22 ft x 14 ft
Three-quarter size About 6 ft 9 in x 3 ft 9 in; sizes vary by maker	81 x 45 in (6.75 x 3.75 ft)	16 ft 9 in x 9 ft 9 in	19 ft 9 in x 12 ft 9 in
Midsize 6 x 3 ft; the common apartment and kids' table	72 x 36 in (6 x 3 ft)	16 ft x 9 ft	19 ft x 12 ft
Mini / tabletop 4 x 2 ft; sits on a dining table	48 x 24 in (4 x 2 ft)	14 ft x 8 ft	17 ft x 11 ft

FOLDED FOR STORAGE (typical, varies by model)

A folding full-size table stands about 60 in wide, 25-30 in deep and 60-65 in tall on its wheels; one half folded up for solo practice needs the full 9 ft length.

TOPS TO SCALE (nested, shared corner)



Minimum room = table + 5 ft behind each end + 3 ft each side; comfortable = + 6 1/2 ft and + 4 1/2 ft. Ends matter more than sides -- players retreat to return spin

Only the full 9 x 5 ft table is a standard (ITTF); three-quarter, midsize and mini are manufacturers' sizes and differ by a few inches between brands
